Let's talk about sewage



Allowing the dumping of raw sewage into our rivers and along the Coast of England is one of the scandals of our time. Here's my recent column which gives my thoughts on this and how we could take action to stop it.

In 1858 the hot summer weather mixed with the human effluent in the River Thames caused the Great Stink, making the work of Parliament almost impossible. Then an active Government, in a confident nation, built a sewage infrastructure much of which survives today. But if you are waiting for similar from the current Government, don't hold your breath.

A recent report showed that last year raw sewage was discharged into England's rivers and coast every three minutes and according to Surfers Against Sewage means there are 83 beaches which people should avoid. Water companies blame all sorts of causes including recent rain – as if our country has been a stranger to heavy rain. In fact, weak regulation has allowed some companies to discharge sewage directly into bathing and fishing waters preferring to risk fines rather than lose profits.

Our recently regenerated coast is a huge attraction for visitors and when they come, businesses flourish. But fresh air, clean beaches and safe waters are also a great attraction for those of us fortunate to live here.

Urgent action is needed around the country and that needs the Environment Agency, facing Government cuts, to take a tough line on regulation. We should enforce mandatory monitoring of outlets, cut discharges and hold water bosses to account through sanctions and fines, without making customers pay. The Government's Environment Bill could have sorted

this but their MP's were whipped to stop tougher legislation. When we left the EU we were promised at least as good environmental protection. It hasn't happened and frankly, it stinks.





I am grateful for Buy The Kilo a business on Tynemouth Station for organising a new exhibition at the station on an environmental theme. It was good to visit on opening night to see the exhibition which has drawn national as well as local artists. Buy The Kilo is, by the way, also a great shop to visit.

We had a Bill ready which would have addressed the problem including the water companies to account. The Government instructed their MP's to vote to stop our Bill which means the much waited clean up will have to wait.

Save Our Ferry



NHS Meeting







Age UK Energy Advice



Age UK has produced a guide for older people who may have missed out on the Energy Bill Support Scheme and is encouraging eligible households to apply for the EBSS Alternative Funding scheme before the deadline on 31st May.

The Alternative Funding scheme will provide a payment of £400, which is equivalent to support provided by the EBSS. The guide includes information on who is eligible for the support, including:

- Care home residents and others in care facilities/sheltered accommodation
 - Park home residents, houseboats and caravans
- Social and private tenants who pay for energy through a landlord on a commercial supply
 - Homes on a heat network/private wire
 - · Off-grid homes
