## Tyne Coast College Update



I was dismayed when parents began contacting me after Tyne Coast College announced they would stop A Level provision mid-course.

I initially wrote to the College as soon as the news emerged and met with the Chief Executive of the College at the earliest opportunity.

I am pleased to report that the college has reversed its decision so far as current Year 12/First Year A level students are concerned, and they will be able to continue to be taught at Queen Alex and complete their courses.

The College authorities admit to have got this wrong but have now moved to put things right. I welcomed that but also made it clear how much distress this has caused.

I am pleased that along with my colleague Mary Glindon MP to have been able to help. We will continue to do all we can to ensure that further 6th form provision is put in place as soon as possible.

## More security on Metro

I wish all the students all the best for the future.

I have welcomed the news that Nexus has decided to deploy more security teams on board Type and Wear Metro services to provide greater customer reassurance in the evenings and tackle anti-social behaviour where it arises.

This will take the security presence on the Metro network to its highest ever level, with security personnel on board almost every single service from 19:00 every day.

I am pleased that Nexus have listened to the concerns of local residents and have made this significant commitment to provide greater reassurance to people using public transport in the evening.

The cost of the expanded security team is being met from increased Metro revenue, together with a contribution from the Safer Streets ASB and transport initiative provided by the Police and Crime Commissioner Kim McGuinness' office.

## Whitley Bay Station Upgrade





Following my meeting with Nexus earlier this year, I'm pleased to hear Nexus is to begin a major restoration project of Whitley Bay Metro station this summer. The historic canopy is to be restored in a £5.3m project. The work starts in July 2023 and will be completed in early 2025. Work on the Grade II listed structure will see the glass in the canopy replaced with more robust modern alternatives, and the steelwork will be strengthened and repainted. The glazing directly above the Metro tracks will also be reinstated, providing a more sheltered environment for passengers. Nexus is also committed to ensuring that disruption is kept to a minimum. ## **Volunteers Week**



## Picnic in the Park





## **Pension Credit Check**



Across the UK 1.4 million pensioners do not claim what they are entitled to. You or a loved one may be entitled up to £3300 per year and £1000 in discounts to things such as Council Tax. Additional benefits are on offer in certain circumstances such as the severe disability or carer's addition. Furthermore, if you are paying a mortgage then you may be entitled to extra income.
