North Shields 800 Website goes live




The new website for the North Shields 800 is now live. It features dozens of exciting events and projects, history resources and information about the town's 800th anniversary celebrations during 2025.

Meeting with Interim Chief Executive



I met with the interim Chief Executive of North Tyneside Council, Jackie Laughton recently. Jackie has been appointed on an interim basis following the retirement from local government of Paul Hanson whom I would like to thank for his outstanding commitment and service to North Tyneside Council over the last 19 years.

First on the agenda with my meeting with Jackie was to congratulate North Tyneside Council on their recent outstanding Ofsted report for children's services. Achieving the highest possible rating of 'outstanding' in all areas for the first time means we are one of only five in the country to receive such an accolade.

We also discussed other local issues including local schools and antisocial behaviour as well as the ongoing regeneration of North Shields and the Fish Quay.

Visit to Northumbria University



I met with Prof Andy Long, Vice-Chancellor and Chief Executive at Northumbria University to discuss the challenges of local education provision and how these challenges are impacting local young people's aspirations.

We discussed the importance of local universities like Northumbria doing everything they can to make sure that local people are able to access higher education should they wish to do so.

I was also pleased to congratulate them on being awarded Modern University of the Year 2025 by the Times and the Sunday Times.

Meeting with the Local Chief Crown Prosecutor



It was good to take the opportunity to meet with the Head of the Crown Prosecution Service North East, Gale Gilchrist in Newcastle recently.

I got an update on how the CPS are working with the police on how to improve the handling of rape and domestic abuse cases and working across the criminal justice system to tackle delays, including through digital transformation.

I was pleased to hear that their new Victim Transformation Programme seeks to improve communication and support for victims throughout the process.

I also heard about their work to prosecute hate crimes and public order offences and their ambition to build confidence amongst the diverse communities they serve.





I met with u3a last year following the launch of their report, 'Learn to Live: A blueprint for better health and wellbeing'.

The report shines a light on the u3a non-formal learning model and the benefits for promoting and maintaining happy, healthy lives.

I recently had a follow up meeting with Jean Cubbin, Regional Trustee of u3a to discuss their progress setting up an All-Party Parliamentary Group and have offered to provide any support I can.

Show Racism the Red Card



Show Racism the Red Card, the UK's leading anti-racism educational charity, was established in January 1996, thanks in part to a donation by then Newcastle United goalkeeper Shaka Hislop.

I recently met with their Chief Executive Ged Grebby at their local office to discuss their exciting plans for the year ahead.

This year, their Schools Competition is encouraging young people from schools and other educational settings to produce creative work with an original anti-racism theme.

The Police and Crime Commissioner Susan Dungworth held a meeting with MPs to discuss the Police Funding Settlement for 2025.

The Government has set out the provisional police funding for 2025/26 as $\hat{A}\pounds17.4$ billion, an increase of up to $\hat{A}\pounds986.9$ million when compared to the 2024-25 police funding settlement.

This settlement represents a real terms increase in force funding of 3.5%, and a cash increase of 6.0%. The additional funding confirmed through this settlement will cover the costs of the police officer pay awards and fund the recruitment and redeployment of more neighbourhood police and PCSOs.

Last Friday, the government announced an additional £100m funding for policing nationwide.

This funding represents a significant step in strengthening neighbourhood policing and ensuring that forces have the necessary resources to deliver safer streets and stronger communities

Ukraine Visa Extension Scheme



February 24th 2025 will mark the 3 year anniversary of the invasion of Ukraine by Russia. Readers may recall that at the time my office was heavily involved in helping local people and Ukrainians seeking assistance in applying for the Ukraine UK Settlement Scheme. Those first 3 years visas will be expiring soon and I am pleased that the Government has now announced the Ukrainian Visa Extension Scheme which will offer a further 18 months stay.

My office recently attended a briefing on the scheme which opens on 4th February. If anyone needs any advice or would like further details on the scheme, please don't hesitate to contact my office who will be happy to help.

Potholes Funding



Pothole damage cost drivers almost $\hat{A} \pounds 500$ million just last year and after years of underinvestment there are 100 times more potholes on our roads than craters on the moon.

I'm pleased the Government has announced a plan to fix seven million extra potholes each year and is investing £1.6 billion this year.

Out and about


