Our Woven Voices






I took the opportunity to visit the new 'Our Woven Voices' sculpture, next to North Shields Magistrates Court.

On National Retail Workers Day, I joined the union Usdaw in celebrating the social and economic importance of retail jobs and retail workers across the UK.

For too long, retail workers have had to put up with persistent anti-social behaviour and abuse which is why I recently voted for the government's Crime and Policing Bill.

The new legislation, places high priority on protecting our high streets. It will end the effective immunity for shop theft of goods below £200. It also includes strong provision to better protect retail workers from assault, creating a new specific offence for assaults on shopworkers that will protect them from threats and violence.

Shop Kind



I would like to encourage local retailers in our area to take advantage of free information and advice from the Association of Convenience Stores (ACS) such as the Crime Guidance, which provides practical advice on effective crime prevention measures - including body-worn cameras, CCTV systems, and staff headsets.

Retailers can also support the #ShopKind campaign, run by ACS and backed by the Home Office, the campaign aims to encourage positive behaviours in shops, acknowledge the important role of shopworkers and raise awareness about the scale and impact of violence and abuse against shopworkers.
